<p>Learning Objectives: After this workshop Child Welfare Professional will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify the dynamics of sexual abuse by a juvenile and assess the difference between normal sexual experimentation, sexually reactive behavior, and sexual abuse. ● Describe the importance of the caseworker’s responsibility to protect the victim(s) from further abuse; to prevent juvenile sex offenders from re-offending, and carry out the steps necessary to assure that the offender is held accountable for his/her behaviors. ● Determine the differences between female and male juvenile sex offenders and between pre-pubescent and adolescent sex offenders and develop an investigative plan and case plan appropriate to the individual and his/her circumstances. ● Identify and coordinate multiple services to multiple parties including the victim, the juvenile offender, the juvenile’s parents or caretakers, and siblings. ● Identify the need for law enforcement and court involvement to motivate the offender and to hold him/her accountable. ● Describe the components of a comprehensive sex offense specific assessment, determine how to obtain the assessment and use the assessment to plan services for the juvenile sex offender. ● Identify various treatment options and understand the complex issues involved in service termination and case closure. 	
<p>Calendar Summary: This training will address the dynamics of sexual abuse by a juvenile and examine the difference between normal sexual experimentation, sexually reactive behavior and sexual abuse. Participants will learn assessment criteria necessary to evaluate offending youth, intervention strategies to manage offending behavior and the purpose and types of treatment available for juvenile sex offenders. The workshop will present the investigative, assessment, case planning, service termination and case closure procedures that should be used when working with the juvenile sex offender, his/her parents/caretakers and the victim. The <u>pre-requisite</u> for this workshop is: "Overview of Child Sexual Abuse."</p>
