

## **QUESTIONS FOR ANALYZING YOUR COURT CASE:**

*\*Small groups should discuss the questions below and use them as a guideline for preparing a chart to post on the wall. Your chart should cover the key concepts of the case as it relates to malpractice. Each member of the group should be prepared to cover 1 or more of the questions with the entire class when we get back together.*

1. What is the name of your case?
2. Where and when did it occur?
3. What type of case was it? (abuse, neglect, other?)
4. Briefly explain the circumstances of the case.
5. Summarize the key reasons why malpractice litigation occurred.
6. Using the definitions on the “*Speaking Malprac-tese*” test, identify the type of litigation that you believe occurred.
7. Summarize key points in the court’s ruling.
8. What actions should agencies take to prevent this type of malpractice litigation from occurring in their agency.
