

REASONS WHY VICARIOUS LIABILITY LITIGATION IN SUPERVISION HAS OCCURRED:

1. Failure to provide adequate information to a supervisee to permit proper practice to occur.
2. Failure to review a supervisee's work.
3. Failure to correctly assess a supervisee's capacity and skill level.
4. Failure to detect a supervisee's error in any aspect of service.
5. Failure to determine that a specialist is needed in a particular situation.
6. Failure to detect or stop a negligent service plan or service that is being continued beyond its effectiveness.
7. Failure to identify a supervisee that is sexually involved with a client or exerting unnecessary influence on a client, even if the supervisee conceals it from the supervisor.
8. Failure to meet regularly with a supervisee.
9. Failure to review and approve a supervisee's decisions.
10. Failure to provide adequate coverage when a supervisee is unavailable.
11. Failure to note that a client's record is not adequate.
12. Failure to detect and act on a supervisee's impairment.
