Engaging Incarcerated Parents

It is estimated that 2.8 percent of our nation's children have at least one parent who is incarcerated. Due to stressors prior to incarceration and, as a direct result of their parents' incarceration, many of these children find themselves in the child welfare system whether it be living with the non-incarcerated parent, living with another relative, or in a foster placement. This workshop provides child welfare practitioners with an understanding of the impact of incarceration on parents, children, and families, the importance of engaging the incarcerated parent, and resources and strategies for accomplishing this.

This workshop is eligible for 6 hours of training credit, as well as 6 hours of continuing education credits for LSW and LCSW.

6 continuing education credits are available for licensed social workers who need to meet their continuing education ethics requirements.
